Ohio Mid-Eastern Governments Association seeks public's input on transportation needs

The Ohio Mid-Eastern Governments Association will host a public involvement meeting next week to explore the transportation needs of Guernsey County and the region.

The meeting will be Wednesday, April 29, at 6:30 p.m. at the Crossroads Branch Library, 63500 Byesville Road, Cambridge.

OMEGA will provide an overview of the transportation systems in Guernsey County and the region, but more interested in citizens' comments about transportation needs and improvements in Guernsey County.

The wish for public participation stems in part from the fact that OMEGA is participating in a pilot program for "Regional Transportation Planning Organization."

The primary objectives of this program are:

- Development of a transportation plan,
- Interagency consultation,
- Stakeholder outreach, and
- Development of regional transportation planning expertise.

"By improving our transportation systems, we will develop a more sustainable economy and improve the quality of life of our residents," OMEGA Executive Director Greg DiDonato said.

Expected among the potential benefits of this program are:

- Expanding regional transportation planning coverage area,
- Strengthening existing partnerships,
- Establishing framework for future data.



Public Involvement Meeting

April 29, 2015

Crossroads Public Library - Cambridge, Ohio

On April 29, 2015, Ms. Jeannette Wierzbicki, P.E. Assistant Executive Director, Transportation/Grants Manager and Mr. Ken Shonkwiler, Transportation Planner/GIS Coordinator from the Ohio Mid-Eastern Governments Association (OMEGA) conducted a public meeting in Guernsey County to discuss the Regional Transportation Plan being developed for the region. A copy of the attendance list is attached and a copy of the presentation will be provided on OMEGA's website and in the appendices to the Regional Transportation Plan.

Ms. Wierzbicki provided a brief overview of OMEGA and the Regional Transportation Plan. After introductions and the overview, Ms. Wierzbicki introduced the breakout session, where attendees were invited to participate in a mapping activity. Ms. Arlene Johnson from SEAT explained many of the current problems regarding funding. A reduction in funding from the county may lead SEAT to reduce services unless additional revenue sources are found. She also pointed out how the current veteran benefit users are forced to wait extremely long periods when using their transit services, and how SEAT is currently unable to provide trips outside of their service area to accommodate veterans. Ms. Johnson also expressed a need for smaller 4wheel drive vehicles to reach clients in remote sections of the county. Ms. Charlene Downing made comments on the recent school bus accident on SR 660 and suggested putting up School Bus Stop Ahead signs where the accident occurred. She also suggested that the area in Buckeyeville, where the accident happened, have a speed reduction from its current 45 mph speed limit. Other general comments included the congestion along SR 209, narrow lanes on SR 209 especially in and around Tractor Supply, widening the turning radius at the intersection of Wheeling Avenue and 11th street in Cambridge, increasing signage and speed limit enforcement outside of Zane State/ Detroit Diesel, installing a bike lane between New Concord and Cambridge along US 40, congestion near the hospital when school lets out, and addressing

crashes on US 22. Randy Comisford from District 5 provided background information on many of these topics as well.

Mr. Shonkwiler then reviewed both regional and Guernsey County transportation data; including areas of concern, congestion, specific transportation needs, and potential projects. Additionally, transportation surveys were provided and completed by the attendees. Meeting attendees were encouraged to submit comments to Ken Shonkwiler by May 29, 2015 at kens@omegadistrict.org or at 326 Highland Avenue, Suite B, Cambridge, OH 43725.

The meeting adjourned by 7:50 pm.
